

# Wilcombe Primary School - Sports Funding Report

## Summary of funding for 2016/17 Academic Year and Plan for 2017 - 18

### **Swimming**

The funding has enabled every child in years 3, 4 and 5 to go swimming as well as the non swimmers in year six. We have been able to pay for a member of staff to gain a higher level of swimming qualification.

### **Transport**

The money has helped part- finance buses. We are able to attend all the sports events without having to rely on parents. A lack of funding for transport could mean not being able to take part.

### **Wider Opportunities/Collaborative Partnerships**

The funding helped us work with Tiverton High school, access the Ventrus Trusts activities as well as use ST Luke's.

### **Additional coaches**

The level of expertise amongst the staff has meant using Premier sport for CPD opportunities to help us produce well-structured lessons is no longer required.

### **CPD**

The funding has helped pay for teachers and HLTAs to further their knowledge both through courses working alongside a level 2/3 coach in different areas this year to develop their skills further (ST Luke's)

### **Resources**

We have bought new equipment to give the children a better PE experience.

## Increased Participation

The funding has also helped us improve our participation. Our numbers have slowly grown over the last few years and we are looking to improve further this year.
