Summary of funding for 2018-19 Academic Year and Plan for 2019 – 20

Swimming

The funding has enabled every child in years 3, 4 and 5 to go swimming as well as the non-swimmers in year 6.

Transport

The money has helped part- finance buses. We are able to attend all the sports events without having to rely on parents. A lack of funding for transport could mean not being able to take part.

Wider Opportunities/Collaborative Partnerships

The funding helped us work with Tiverton High school, access the Ventrus Trusts activities as well as work closely with St Luke's School and the Exeter arena.

<u>CPD</u>

The funding has helped pay for teachers and HLTAs to further their knowledge through CPD that has been delivered by the PE Lead, who attended a REAL PE conference. There has also been CPD for staff led by specialists.

Resources

We have bought new equipment to give the children a better PE experience as well as install a new running track on the school field.
