Wilcombe Primary School - Sports Funding Report

Summary of funding for 2020-21 Academic Year and Plan for 2021 – 22

Swimming

This year because of COVID-19, all children have not been able to access swimming this academic year.

Transport

This year because of COVID-19, all children have not been able to access any sporting events therefore we have not used any transport.

Wider Opportunities/Collaborative Partnerships

The funding helped us fund the Year 6's to be able to participate in the Exmoor Challenge. Due to COVID, our usual opportunities with other schools have not be able to go ahead.

CPD

The funding has helped pay for teachers and HLTAs to further their knowledge through CPD that has been delivered by the PE Lead, who attended a REAL PE conference. There has also been CPD for staff led by specialists.

Resources

We have bought new equipment to give the children a range of activities and games to play at break time. We have bought enough equipment for each 'bubble' to have a sufficient amount and resulted in bubbles not having to share equipment. We have bought a storage shed to go in the playground to store this playtime equipment.

We have bought a MUGA on the back playground to allow the children to have access to the playground all times of the year.

We have bought new gymnastics mats and a trampette to allow the children to access and experience new gymnastics skills.

We have also bought new equipment such as bibs and new netball hoops.

We have also bought a line marker to be able to use on the field. We used this for sports day and will be able to use it for many other events.
